Complex numbers and functions; complex differential operators; Cauchy-Riemann equations; analytic and harmonic functions; Cauchy formula; Power series representation of analytic functions; Liouville's theorem; zeros of analytic functions; Laurent series and meromorphic functions; argument principle, the residue theorem and applications; counting zeros and poles of meromorphic functions; maximum modulus principle and Schwartz lemma; Infinite series and products, applications - Blaschke products.

Time permitting: Special functions, Proof of the prime number theorem.
